GROWTH OF STEM

BY 2020, IT IS EXPECTED THAT **50 BILLION DEVICES** WILL BE CONNECTED TO THE INTERNET. That is more than six times the world population.

The annual amount of data generated is measured in zettabytes now and most of it is stored using cloud technology. Cloud technology is what makes it possible for you to stream your favorite show, ask your smartphone a question and access your presentation from any device. It's gaining momentum so quickly some analysts predict a third of all data will pass through or live in the cloud by 2020.

The U.S. Department of Defense is asking for \$5.5 BILLION IN FISCAL YEAR 2016 for cyber-related security functions.

JOB OUTLOOK

The overall outlook for STEM fields is more favorable than a majority of other careers. The number of available STEM jobs has increased by 28 percent since 2000, compared to six percent for all jobs. That trend is expected to continue through 2020.



U.S. News and World Report's No. 1 Best STEM job: COMPUTER SYSTEMS ANALYST Its unemployment rate sits at just 2.6 percent. Others range on the list from a low of 1.8 percent up to a high of just 4 percent.

PRESIDENT'S CLUB

Florida Poly selects **top academic students** from the admitted student pool to participate in a competition called the President's Club. In 2016, 40 students participated in the competition and seven students were awarded full scholarships totaling **\$16,000 per student** to cover tuition, housing, meal plan and books.

Prior to the competition day, students are given a prompt to drive their presentation. Last year, we asked students to select a national or global problem that could be fixed through engineering or technology. Students were then tasked with coming up with the solution and **presenting their ideas to a panel of judges.**
